



### The Floyd L. Maines Veterans Memorial Arena

The Floyd L. Maines Veterans Memorial Arena is a 5,000-seat arena (with up to 7,000 person capacity depending on configuration). It is home to the Binghamton Senators (American Hockey League), minor-league affiliate of the Ottawa Senators (NHL). The Arena anchors the downtown area as a center for a wide variety of sports, concerts, expos, and family events.

The Arena was built in 1973 as a result of a nationwide design competition. Some of the top stars in the world have played the Arena at one time or another. The first act at the Arena was the Barnum & Bailey circus in May 1973. Chicago played the first concert at the Arena (with Bruce Springsteen as opener) on June 20, 1973. The first regular tenants of the Arena were the Broome Dusters (NAHL, 1973-1977), followed by the Binghamton Dusters (AHL, 1977-1980), the Binghamton Whalers (AHL, 1980-1990), the Binghamton Rangers (AHL, 1990-1997), and the B.C. Icemen (UHL, 1997-2002).

Today, the Arena is home to the Binghamton Senators (AHL, 2002-present), and it continues to provide a constant stream of top-class events to the Greater Binghamton area.

### Featured Employee of the Month

Steve Whited, Senior Manager of Forecasting and Inventory Management, Sidney, N.Y.



Steve Whited has more than 30 years of practical experience in forecasting and inventory management, beginning with 13 years as a manufacturing supervisor and manager at International Paper and then in various roles at the ACC O Brands Sidney facility for over 17 years. Steve generously shares his professional expertise with college students – it's his way of passing on his knowledge to the forecasting and inventory control profession. His twice -a-year visits to classes in the Binghamton University Business Operations Management program enthusiastically captivate the students' interest and, in so doing, invigorate his own commitment to his job.

The students energize me," Steve says. "Their questions are astute, and they are very engaged, asking plenty of questions. They make it easy." He gets their attention right from the start of his presentation, with his first slide showing their potential earnings if they graduate and go into forecasting/inventory management. He also shares stories from the field, and answers one of his most common questions, "Why don't companies order their own products from China," by explaining the concept of manufacturability.



Steve has been speaking to the Business Operations Management classes for five years. He provides insight into the module on CPFR (collaboration, planning, forecasting, replenishment) speaking to about 350 students each time he visits. Steve's experience in the inventory control field gives him his expertise for the class. His roles in Sidney include analyst, assistant supervisor, assistant manager and now senior manager of forecasting and inventory management. He is vice -president of the local APICS chapter (American Production and Inventory Control), and his 20-year involvement with that group gives him a broad knowledge of distribution and warehousing to share with students. Steve has seen many changes through


the years with the Sidney operation, including system and organizational changes, mergers, and more closely monitored inventory levels and OSMI (Obsolete and Slow Moving Inventory ) reporting.

"It's an exciting, growing time," Steve says. "Now we have added School and Office Products to inventory we manage. I enjoy being part of a team that works so well with customers and our internal colleagues." Steve brings ACCO Brands connections to Binghamton University in other ways, as well, through his involvement with campus events. At a recent campus job fair, Sidney HR representatives were asked where Steve was. His connections to the students are highly valued by both the Sidney HR team and the college's Business Operations Management program.
